

Hammer Forum was founded in 1991 and is a non-governmental charity organization.

Hammer Forum consist of a body of German physicians who provide medical treatment for children in war- and precarious regions of Europe, Africa and Asia.

In Eritrea the Hammer Forum initiated an humanitarian project in 1995.



Why Eritrea?

- Past 30 years war region (1962-1993)
- No medical school until 2006
- Three pediatricians for 2,5 Mio. children < 18 y
- No pedriatric surgery
- One of the poorest countries of the world




The Goal of the Eritrean Mission


- ■To create a pediatric-medical infrastructure
- ■To build, equipe and run the International Operation Centre for Children in Asmara (IOCCA)
- ■To initiate and maintain medical and surgical treatment for Eritrean children on a multidisciplinary base including open heart surgery
- ■To support the Medical School at the University of Asmara
- ■To organize and run a Teaching hospital for postgraduate medical education in Eritrea

















Conclusion

The goal of establishing a Pediatric Cardiac Surgical program in Eritrea has been achieved by a multi-institutional European cooperation of individual surgical teams under the umbrella of the Hammer Forum.

Early and long term results are comparable to those of the best Cardiac Surgical Units in Europe and USA.
